



Notice of Race

The Royal Dee Yacht Club Regatta 2009

Saturday 1st to Monday 3rd May 2010

1. Organising Authority

The Organising Authority shall be the Royal Dee Yacht Club.

2. Rules

Racing will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

3. Conditions of Entry

3.1 The Regatta is open to boats with an IRC certificate for classes 1 and 2, other classes may contain sports boat or cruiser PY boats.

3.2 ORC category IV will apply to Classes 1 and 2.

3.3 The IRC Rules Parts 1, 2, and 3 shall apply.

3.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and sending it, together with the required fee. To Debbie Edge, The Homestead, Middlewich Road, Oakmere, Cheshire, CW8 2HL
Entries should be returned by Friday 16th April

3.5 Late Entries will be accepted at the Holyhead Sailing Club up until 0930 Saturday 1st May 2010.

3.6 The Royal Dee Yacht Club has adopted the RYA Racing Charter, boats are expected to adopt its principles.

- a. A boat is entirely responsible for her own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in this Notice of Race or Sailing instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility.
 - b. It is for the boat to decide whether she is fit to sail in the conditions in which she will find herself. By launching or going to sea, the boat confirms that she is fit for those conditions and her crew is competent to sail and compete in them.
 - c. The boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least. £2,000,000.
 - d. Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the boat nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race committee, the race officer, patrol boats and beach masters.
 - e. The provision of patrol boats does not relieve the boat of her responsibilities.
 - f. The boat is responsible to ensure that she is equipped and seaworthy so as to be able to face extremes of weather; that there is a crew sufficient in number, experience and fitness to withstand such weather; and that the safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and in date and that the crew know how to use it.

4. Fees

Class 1 and 2 £50 up to 16 April 2010 and £80 thereafter.

Sportsboats and non spinnaker £30 up to 16 April 2010 and £50 thereafter

ANY YACHT WHO ENTERED IN 2009 WISHING TO ENTER BEFORE 16 APRIL MAY HAVE A 50% DISCOUNT ON THEIR ENTRY FEE. PLEASE APPLY YOUR OWN CALCULATIONS.

There will be Free berthing at the Holyhead Marina (where allocated) for the duration of the event.

5. Registration

Registration will take place at the Holyhead Sailing Club from 1900 on Friday 30th April and 0830 to 0915 on Saturday 1 May 2010.

6. Dates of Racing 1st to 3rd May 2010

7. Number of Races

Classes 1 and 2 6 Races

Additional Classes 6 Races

8. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1055.

9. Measurement

Each Boat in Classes 1 & 2 shall produce a valid Rating Certificate.

10. Sailing Instructions

These should be available early in April and will be posted on the Web site www.royaldee.co.uk and available on registration.

11. Venue

The waters adjacent to Holyhead

12. The Courses

These will be windward – leeward, ‘around the cans’ or ‘short off-shore’.

13. Penalty System

The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

14. Scoring

(a) When fewer than 3 races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When 4 or more races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

15. Prizes

Middle Mouse Trophy Awarded to best performing yacht overall

Class 1 Overall Butterfield Trophy

Class 2 Overall Royal Dee Trophy

Sportsboats Sportsboat trophy

Non Spinnaker Non Spinnaker trophy

In addition there may be other glassware and special prizes dependant upon entry.

16. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

17. Insurance

Each participating Boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2,000,000 per event or the equivalent.
